

# »Cities as Global Actors 2025«

Cities around the world are increasingly taking responsibility for global challenges, including climate change. In December 2025, the **Cities as Global Actors** conference will bring together representatives from Berlin's 19 partner cities – from Paris to Jakarta to Buenos Aires – to make urban diplomacy tangible. The focus will be on sharing successful international strategies and how cities can implement climate mitigation and adaptation on the ground, building new alliances, and strengthening cities as global players.

The public part of the conference on December 2, 2025, will focus on "**Cities as Climate Actors: Responsibility, Innovation, Action.**" It will explore how cities around the world are stepping up to address the climate crisis by taking responsibility, driving innovation, and turning commitments into concrete action.

Voices from science and urban practice will frame the conversation: Prof. Dr. Johan Rockström will highlight the planetary boundaries that define the urgency for urban climate action, while Prof. Carlos Moreno will present practical pathways for cities to lead sustainable transformation.

Stakeholders from international urban policy, foundations, think tanks, and civil society organizations will be invited to contribute their perspectives and experiences. The event aims to foster dialogue, inspire collaboration, and strengthen the role of cities as key actors in global climate governance.
