Revisiting the Budapest Cultural Forum 1985 as a tool for Political Change

The geopolitical landscape has changed dramatically. Forty years after the 1985 Budapest Cultural Forum, which was pivotal in the Helsinki Process, the urgency to revisit its core discussions on human and cultural rights has returned. Then, artists and intellectuals created a space to challenge political constraints from the ground up - an approach that remains vital today. But tomorrow we must consider the legacy of the Helsinki Accords: The principles adopted in it are forgotten when war rages in Europe, against the principle that borders shall not be changed by force. We need a renewed, independent cultural forum - drawing inspiration from the 1985 Forum and the Gulliver initiative; to re-empower artists and thinkers in shaping Europe's future.

At a time when borders are re-emerging – politically, geographically, and mentally – the panel Borderless asks how art, culture, and education can create spaces that remain open. Borderlessness here is not only about physical mobility but also about the capacity to share perspectives, to extend collective memory, and to turn differences into sources of inspiration. In the European context, where national narratives and historical fractures continue to resonate, the arts play a crucial role as a medium of transgression and transformation. This is also the moto of the European Cultural Capital Nova Gorica, where two Slovenian Protagonists come from

The discussion brings together voices from Central and Eastern Europe, with a special focus on Slovenia, and connects them with perspectives from across the continent. Panelists Anja Medved, Dr. Kaja Širok and Oleksandr Butsenko will explore how artistic practice can open memory beyond the confines of nation-states and how aesthetic experience can become a tool of democratic participation. Borderless is thus also a cultural attitude: one that does not erase difference but reframes it as a resource for rethinking Europe.

At the core lies the question of how art and education can counter polarization and strengthen a shared European horizon. Borderless is conceived as an invitation to renegotiate the common ground: through dialogue between cultures, through shared responsibility for memory, and through the collective shaping of an open European future. We ask the question: What do borders mean today?
